



Instructional Information and Lesson Packet

The Monroe County School District is excited that we have been approved for the non-traditional instruction program that we are calling MCS D@home for up to ten missed days during the school year. Inside this packet you will find the lessons for each of the ten days.

Why are we participating in this program?

The Monroe County School District wants to continue to maximize educational opportunities while maintaining a consistent school calendar.

****Place this packet in a safe location.**** Please place this packet in a safe place so your child will be able to pull it out and work from home on non-traditional instructional days. (For example, on top of the refrigerator or microwave, underneath the phone book, inside the top drawer of dresser, etc.)

How do I know what lessons to complete?

Each day is marked with the day (Day 1, Day 2, etc.), theme, grade level, and six different lesson choices. The students will pick **ONE lesson from the top row**, and **ONE lesson from the bottom row** to complete each MCS D@home day. The students will complete a total of **TWO lessons per MCS D@home day**. The day correlates with the number of days missed. On the first day missed, students will complete Day 1 lessons. On the second day missed, they will complete Day 2. **** Students in dual credit courses (high school level) need to continue to follow the syllabus. ****

Lesson themes are based on the 7 Habits of Effective People and Program Review areas:

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| Day 1 – Be Proactive | Day 6- Synergize |
| Day 2- Begin with the End in Mind | Day 7- Sharpen the Saw |
| Day 3- Put First Things First | Day 8- Arts and Humanities |
| Day 4 – Think Win-Win | Day 9- Practical Living |
| Day 5- Seek First to Understand, then to Be Understood | Day 10- Writing |

Again, the student has CHOICE in which lessons they are able to complete. (One from each row, for a total of TWO completed per MCS D@home day.)

When do I turn in the lessons?

Students need to turn in their completed lessons the next regularly scheduled school day.

Who do I call when I need help?
